An active member of the Wellesley Friends Meeting, Dick also retains his affiliation with Unitarian Universalism. He is a graduate of Dartmouth College, and holds a Masters Degree in Social Work from the University of Pittsburgh and a PhD from Brandeis University. Now retired, he and his wife, Jill, live in Waltham, MA, where he is active working for affordable housing.

Friends of Adin Ballou was founded in 1999 to study, preserve, and carry on the legacy of Adin Ballou, nineteenth-century minister, pacifist, reformer, and founder of the Hopedale Community.
